GOLD BEACH HIGH SCHOOL



Believe You Can Achieve seniors at Gold Beach adopted a trail previously used by people to access the Rogue River, mostly to fish. They created sign posts and prepared a brochure for hikers. Based on the number of brochures being used, the trail is appreciated. They also continue to maintain the front flower garden at their high school by watering and weeding.

MYRTLE POINT HIGH SCHOOL

PACIFIC HIGH SCHOOL



Due to the pandemic, Believe You Can Achieve seniors got a late start on projects this year. However, they worked hard on Crooked Fir Trail and planted and maintained plants at the Elk River Fish Hatchery.

COQUILLE HIGH SCHOOL

Believe You Can Achieve students at Coquille monitor Cunningham Creek which runs through the school campus. This year they planted additional willows and osier dogwood. They planted bulbs and flowers at the entrance to their campus. They also prepared begonia baskets to sell in order to sustain the campus greenhouse.



SOUTH MEDFORD HIGH SCHOOL BEAR CREEK



South Medford students have worked with Oregon Stewardship in the past to earn their Senior Project Hours. However this year, the district did not require senior projects. As a result, we were able to have a fall and spring group of students working on Bear Creek. Students have added 1/4 of a mile of a new bark chip walking trail along the creek and planted hundreds native species plants. We will have teams of students at the creek all summer watering and weeding, striving for a 95% plant survival.
