After a winter storm, a creek jumped its bank and flooded a trail. Students worked to divert the water back to the creek, wearing boots provided by Jim and Carla. Students at Coquille continue to plant willows and osier dogwood at Cunningham Creek as well as maintain the area around the on-campus hatchery. They also help with the flower bed at the entrance to the school.
